

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as introduced reflects Total Revenues of \$ 161,440, Total Appropriations, including any Accumulated Deficit if any, of \$193,940 and Total Unrestricted Net Position utilized of 32,500; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget as introduced reflects Total Capital Appropriations of \$0 and Total Unrestricted Net Position planned to be utilized as funding thereof, of \$ 0; and

WHEREAS, the schedule of rates, fees and other charges in effect will produce sufficient revenues, together with all other anticipated revenues to satisfy all obligations to the holders of bonds of the Authority, to meet operating expenses, capital outlays, debt service requirements, and to provide for such reserves, all as may be required by law, regulation or terms of contracts and agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget/Program, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:31-2, does not confer any authorization to raise or expend funds; rather it is a document to be used as part of the said Authority's planning and management objectives. Specific authorization to expend funds for the purposes described in this section of the budget, must be granted elsewhere; by bond resolution, by a project financing agreement, by resolution appropriating funds from the Renewal and Replacement Reserve or other means provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Weymouth Township Municipal Utilities Authority, at an open public meeting held on March 16, 2016 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, and the Capital Budget/Program of the Weymouth Township Municipal Utilities Authority for the fiscal year beginning, January 1, 2016 and ending, December 31, 2016 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the said Authority's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

The 2016 budget is consistent with the 2015 adopted budget. The only changes in excess of 10% are in advertising and other administration to better allocate the budget funds.

The 2016 Sewer rate has been increase to account for increased costs and to begin reducing the accumulated prior year deficit. The water rate was decreased to offset the increase in sewer rates to users.

3. Describe the state of the local/regional economy and how it may impact the proposed Annual Budget, including the planned Capital Budget/Program.

The local economy is stable and the number of users is consistent.

4. Describe the reasons for utilizing Unrestricted Net Position in the proposed Annual Budget, i.e. rate stabilization, debt service reduction, to balance the budget, etc. If the Authority's budget anticipates a use of Unrestricted Net Position, this question must be answered.

Net position was used to balance the budget.

The Board monitors expenditures and in 2015 raised the sewer rate to begin reducing the prior year deficit. It is estimated that the deficit will be funded over approximately 10 years.
